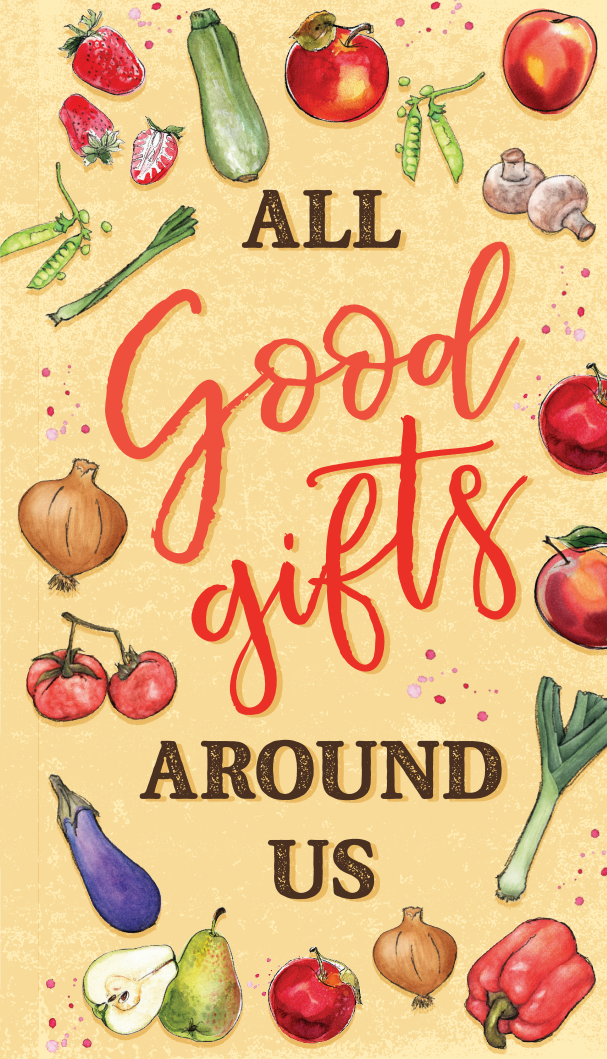



HARVEST IS A TIME TO TRUST



It is with a sense of trust that farmers plough the ground and sow their seed. Then they wait. Eventually, the weather is just right for harvest and quickly the crop is gathered in.

Jesus used this analogy to illustrate God's work in people's lives when He said:

'The kingdom of God is as if a man should scatter seed on the ground, and should sleep by night and rise by day,

*and the seed should sprout and grow, he himself does not know how. For the earth yields crops by itself: first the blade, then the head, after that the full grain in the head. But when the grain ripens, immediately he puts in the sickle, because the harvest has come.'*³

The good news of Jesus is like seed being planted in your mind and heart. Sometimes seeds grow quickly, and at other times the process is slow, but as soon as you realise your personal need to ask for forgiveness and new life in Jesus, the time has come for harvest! God has caused His seed to grow, and you mustn't delay. The moment you turn to Jesus, you become a citizen of the kingdom of God – forgiven and saved to have life with God forever.
