

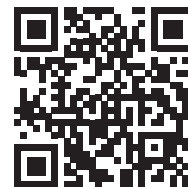

THE LORD IS MY SHEPHERD? PSALM 23

Its words are still loved and sung as a Christian hymn all over the world. You probably learnt it by heart, and I'm sure have sung it many times. It was written by the shepherd-king, David. Psalm 23 has been a help to millions of people. *(The psalm is printed at the end.)*

God is pictured as a loving, caring Shepherd of His sheep. If you have trusted Him as your Shepherd, He promises to be with you in life, in death and for eternity.

Look at verse 1.

God, the Good Shepherd, can be with you throughout the whole of life's journey. You need never lack anything. All that your heavenly Father knows you have need of,

He will provide. We do not always understand everything but God knows what He is doing, and does all things well.

We can cast all our care on Him, for He cares for us. Jesus told us not to worry, but to give our burdens to the Lord who will sustain us. Worry is needless, useless and godless. There is a loving Shepherd whom we can trust in all things.

Now look at verse 4.

God, the Good Shepherd, can be with you in the hour of death. You need never be lonely. God promises to be with us even when we are at our weakest. If we are trusting in Him, He will never leave us or forsake us.



Look at verse 6.

God, the Good Shepherd, can be with you for ever. You need never be lost. No one is good enough for heaven. You may have said, 'I've never done anyone any harm', but the Bible says, 'For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.' We have not always been good Samaritans! God, who is so holy, could have condemned each one of us to hell, but He wants to be our Shepherd, to take us home one day to heaven.

He can do this because of Jesus. Jesus said, 'The Good Shepherd lays down His life for the sheep.' Jesus Christ came into the world, and went about doing good and great things. But when He was crucified He did something very wonderful. He died, taking on Himself the punishment for all that is wrong in our lives. He died for our sin.

Do you remember the hymn: 'There is a Green Hill Far Away'? It says:

*He died that we might be forgiven
He died to make us good,
That we might go at last to heaven
Saved by His precious blood.*

A little boy, years ago, was taught in Sunday School the five words; 'The Lord is my Shepherd'. To help him learn them, each word was linked to a finger on his left hand. Tragically, some time later, the boy was caught in a snowstorm in the hills. By the time he was found sadly his little body had frozen to death. But the boy's right hand fingers were grasping tightly the fourth finger of his left hand. The finger reminding him of the words, 'The Lord is MY shepherd'.
