There is good news today!

You don't have to be overwhelmed by newspaper headlines or even your own problems. God can be with you today—and every day.

God knows the sense of emptiness we all experience. He sees us trying to fill his place in our lives with friends or pleasure or success. But apart from him there is no lasting satisfaction even in the good things of life. Only the God who made us can meet our deepest needs.

The root of our problem is separation from God. The Bible tells us that long ago humankind rebelled against God and his design for the world. And we continue to rebel: “for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God” (Romans 3:23).
