

Someone cares for you.

He knows your present circumstances. He knows your very thoughts. And he is calling to you now: "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). And he died on the cross of Calvary to fulfill God's plan of salvation: "he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5).

When he arose from the grave he triumphed over sin and death, promising all who will receive him: "Because I live, you also will live" (John 14:19).

You can be sure that this very moment Jesus cares for you and wants to meet your needs. For the risen Savior is both God and man: being man he understands your every need; being God he is able to deliver you from despair and hopelessness.

Because Jesus is the risen Son of God, he has power to forgive your sins and give you new, eternal life: "if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9).

Because Jesus lived on earth as a man, he understands your feelings and needs. Through his Spirit he offers you inner peace and strength. Through his people he offers encouragement and companionship.
