Jesus once asked his followers this question.


How would you answer? Who is Jesus?

A myth? A man? A teacher? A sage?

A king?

The story of the Bible – stretching from its first page to its last – is an answer to that question.

It’s a story that begins like this...

But the first people rebelled.





They turned against their Creator and followed their own way, even though it would cost them their lives.

Deep down, every human being since then has made the same choice. We don't want God to be in charge of our lives or our world. We want to rule over all of it – and now all of it is broken.

Sin poisoned God's perfect creation, giving way to sickness, injustice and death. It grows like a weed in even our best relationships.

It separates us from one another, and from God. When we reject God's rule, we make him our enemy, and one day we will face his judgment.



But rather than cast off humanity, in love God the Father sent his Son, Jesus, to enter into the world he created – the one broken by our sin – to be the King we needed.

In the person of Jesus, God himself became human like us. He breathed our air; he experienced our joys and sorrows.

Jesus lived a life of perfect love and obedience – the life God intended us to live.





He gave glimpses of the world as it was meant to be – as it originally was – as he healed the sick, welcomed the outcast, and made time for those society had forgotten.

And he called everyone to turn from their sin and follow him in faith.

Some believed his words and embraced him as King.

Others rejected him. They crowned him with thorns, and murdered him by hanging him on a cross.



But God had a plan.

Jesus willingly gave himself up to die on that cross to save us from God's judgment and the death we deserved.

On that cross, he experienced God's judgment in our place. He exchanged our rebellion for his obedience; our brokenness for his perfection.

The Son of God died so we could live.

But Jesus didn't stay dead. On the third day God raised him to life again.


