# In the beginning was the Word...

These words were written by someone who lived with Jesus for three years... his name was John.

> <sup>1</sup> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

<sup>2</sup> He was with God in the beginning.

<sup>3</sup> Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made.

### The God who made everything

John introduces us to 'the Word':

- Twice he tells us that the Word was already there 'in the beginning' (vv. 1, 2)
- So the Word existed before time, before the beginning... in short, the Word is eternal.

#### But who or what is the Word?

- The Word is God. (v. 1)
- The Word is a person (called Him). (v. 3)
- He made absolutely everything, no exceptions.

Already we're being introduced to the Creator!

But John's claims for the Word go even further...

# In him was life...

...and that life was the light of all mankind.

<sup>4</sup>In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.

<sup>5</sup> The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.


## Life and light

But what difference does the Word make for life?

- As Creator, the Word is the source of all life... (v. 4)
- ...and He is the source of understanding (light) for all people.

The darkness in our world can't stop Him bringing life and light to mankind. (v. 5)

For 2,000 years His message has been going out across our world unchanged. In fact...



Life: In John's book, the word usually means spiritual life – eternal life that starts now and lasts forever.
